Thank you for choosing to purchase one of my products. As with all products containing Essential Oils, please check ingredients if you have any sensitivities to certain Oils. Generally contraindications for Essential Oils refer to when the Oil is used at 100% strength. My products are generally diluted in a base product such as Shea Butter; Moisturiser; Shampoo Base etc. If you are unsure, please check with your doctor before using any of my products. The Insect Repellent is NOT diluted. It requires you to mix it in a spray bottle 50 ml per 2 litres.

This product is made from the very best Essential Oils in a Sweet Almond Oil base. The Essential Oils have been chosen very specifically for their insect repelling qualities. The Insect Repellent is a concentrate and 50 mls makes up to 2 litres. Simply mix in a spray bottle, shake and spray. You can vary the strength depending on whether you are using it on animals or people. It is suitable for use on children (test for reactions first).

Clove Bud – is commonly used as a component in bug repellent because the vapor is very potent for the olfactory senses of many insects. Traditionally, a few drops of clove oil were placed on the bedsheets at night to keep bugs away.

Neem Oil – Traditional Ayurvedic uses of neem include the treatment of acne, fever, leprosy, malaria, ophthalmia and tuberculosis. Various folk remedies for neem include use as an anthelmintic, antifeedant, antiseptic, diuretic, emmenagogue, contraceptive, febrifuge, parasiticide, pediculocide and insecticide. It has been used in traditional medicine for the treatment of tetanus, urticaria, eczema, scrofula and erysipelas.

Citronella – The health benefits of Citronella Essential Oil can be attributed to its properties as an antibacterial, antidepressant, antiseptic, antispasmodic, anti-inflammatory, deodorant, diaphoretic, diuretic, febrifuge, fungicidal, insect repellent, stomachic, stimulant, tonic and vermifuge substance.

Lavender – repels mosquitoes because mosquitoes dislike the scent lavender gives off.

Rosewood – rosewood oil is extracted from Aniba rosaeodora, an evergreen tree indigenous to Peru and Brazil. Also called “bois-de-rose,” it belongs to the Laurel plant family along with camphor, bay, cinnamon and cassia. Rosewood’s scent is very pleasant with health benefits reported for pain relief, wound healing, stress reduction and asthma. It is also very effective in repelling insects.

Cedarwood - The health benefits of Cedarwood Essential Oil can be attributed to its properties as an antiseborrheic, antiseptic, antispasmodic, tonic, astringent, diuretic, emenagogue, expectorant, insecticidal, sedative and fungicidal substance. Cedarwood oil has been in use as a mosquito and insect repellent for a long time. When used in vaporizers, it drives away mosquitoes, flies and other insects in a large area around the house.
